There are exciting new developments at the Jewish Home. The Los Angeles Jewish Home announced plans to develop a senior care community in The Village at Playa Vista and the surrounding areas that will serve the residential, healthcare and in-home needs of upwards of 600 seniors on the Westside of Los Angeles. This marks the first time in its 100 year history that Jewish Home will have a physical presence on the Westside. Designed to inspire health and wellness, Fountainview at Gonda Westside will include a host of thoughtful amenities and desirable services to create a resort

environment. As a Continuing Care Retirement Community (CCRC), residents will have the security of knowing that as their needs change, they can continue to enjoy life to its fullest. Along with upscale independent living residences, the community will offer 24 assisted living and memory care apartments. Residents will have access to the highest quality of in-home personal care services available through the Los Angeles Jewish Home as well as priority access to its renowned nursing services, should the need arise.

Our Brandman Centers for Senior Care, the Jewish Home's new Program of Allinclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE) facility, on the Grancell Village Campus opened this February 2013, allowing us to serve residents who can stay in their homes with families. The Brandman Centers provide programming, meals, and medical care for 180 or so seniors while they live at the home. With plans to open more centers, this will help us achieve our goal of serving 5000 residents per year within 5 years.

The Jewish Home continues to serve seniors in need with quality and dignity. We add life to years and years to life. The funds that The Executives raise enable us to provide care and help us fulfill the 5th Commandment to "Honor Thy Father and Thy Mother" by giving comfort and piece of mind to the frail and elderly that need our support the most.

ESTELLE CURTISS

Life is Beautiful

Born in 1911, Estelle Curtiss grew up as part of a musically inclined family. Her parents, Johanna and Mendel "Max" Katz, worked in the garment industry, and though they were poor, their love of music and family sustained them. Max, who worked as a shneider (tailor), was a dedicated music lover, and Johanna, who was a seamstress, sang beautifully.

The couple was blessed with five children – Jean, Al, Mickey and Estelle, as well as an older daughter who tragically passed away during the flu epidemic of 1918. Al played the violin, Estelle was drawn to the piano and Mickey took up the clarinet in high school. Young Estelle could sing and dance, and together they made quite the quartet. "We would put on our own shows," recalls Estelle. "There was an alley alongside our house. The neighbors would come around and watch. We loved it!"

When she was about 8 years old, Estelle entered the world of Yiddish theatre. She also went to dance school, and, as a teenager, studied ballet. "I sang and danced all over the city and state," she says. "I was pretty busy!" After graduating high school at 17, she joined a vaudeville group, but after six months of performing on stage realized that vaudeville was declining and was not the right fit.

At 21, Estelle met her future husband, Gerson Curtiss. As it turns out, Gerson remembered seeing her perform in junior high. Within four years, the couple was married. Gerson worked as a stockbroker and Estelle tried her hand at bookkeeping. They raised three children: Jonathan, Judith and Susan. Though Estelle no longer performed, she and Gerson belonged to various folk dance clubs, which they enjoyed tremendously.

Estelle's brother Mickey became a successful musician and comedian, specializing in Jewish humor. He continued to perform his unique brand of entertainment until his death in 1985. Mickey's son, Joel Grey, is internationally known for his talent on stage and screen, and his granddaughter, Jennifer Grey, has a successful acting career as well. The entire extended Katz clan gets together a couple of times each year, carrying on Johanna and Max's dedication to family.

It was Mickey's career that led the rest of the family to Los Angeles. When Gerson passed away at the age of 85, Estelle continued living in their Beverly Hills apartment. "I lived there for 46 years," says Estelle. "I cooked and did everything for myself...until I was 99. Then, going up and down the stairs became a little too much for me." When it came to making a decision about where to go, she continues, "The Jewish Home was the only choice! It's a wonderful place. You have everything you could want here."

While Estelle values all of the services and programs offered by the Home, she particularly appreciates the medical care and activities. "I love Word Games with Jacqui, bingo, going to concerts and movies off-campus and, of course, all the musical performances." Estelle is an avid reader and particularly enjoys novels by female authors or with strong female characters.

At 101, Estelle's advice for healthy aging is simple: "Just be yourself...that's all! Life is beautiful, but you have to have a sense of humor. Be happy and laugh."

Reflecting on her time at the Jewish Home, Estelle says that, "The Home has given me a feeling of peace. I don't have to worry about the outside world – they'll take care of me here." She encourages others to be a part of the Home by donating their time or resources. "It's a very worthwhile organization, and you should get involved to help keep people happy and well, and to serve the Jewish people."






ALL IN AT THE POKER TOURNAMENT






